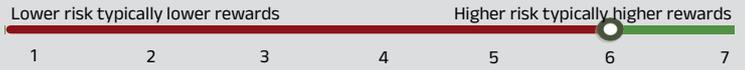

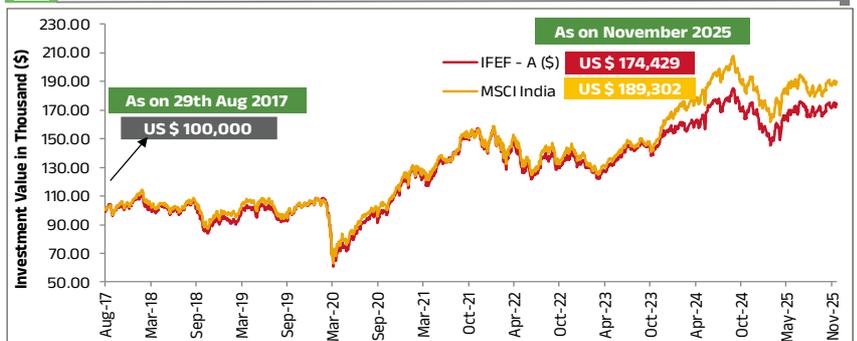

- India's 3QCY25 GDP sharply exceeded expectations, coming in at 8.2% YoY (Consensus: 7.4%), accelerating from an already strong 7.8% in 2QCY25
- Oil prices fell by 1.3% in Nov'25, following a 4.0% dip in Oct'25, due to easing Middle-East tensions, expectations of Russia-Ukraine peace plans and expectations of higher OPEC+ production
- The INR depreciated by 0.8% over the month and ended the month at 89.46/USD, with a one-year depreciation now at 5.5%
- India is considering extending an import tariff (safeguard duty) on some steel products to counter cheaper imports primarily from China
- SEBI plans to undertake a comprehensive review of its mutual fund rules, including unbundling of broking fee, as well as stock broker regulations at its board meeting next month
- India's securities market regulator is examining the prospect of allowing foreign investors to move toward net settlement of their cash equity trades that could potentially boost turnover

MSCI India posted a modest gain of 1.0% in Nov'25, outperforming the MSCI APxJ/EM indices by 3.9%/3.4% respectively. Large caps rose by 1.7%, outperforming Small and Mid caps by 3.7%/0.6% respectively. The Nifty 50 rose by 1.9%, hitting an all-time high of 26,298 on Nov 27 (intraday), and closing the month at 26,203. IT (3.6%) and Energy (3.0%) were the top performing sectors while Utilities (-4.7%) and Real Estate (-4.6%) were the worst. The performance was driven by progressive optimism around an India-US trade deal, better-than-expected 2QFY26 earnings and an improving macro environment (consensus beating 2QFY26 GDP, low inflation, above-normal monsoon, improving credit growth, pick-up in IP). The announcement of labour reforms, domestic demand due to festive season and GST 2.0 impact while continue to drive growth moving forward.

Indian equities have experienced significant pressure over the past year, driven by a confluence of factors – anemic earnings growth, low beta and a lack of direct AI exposure. However, with supportive fiscal and monetary policies, recovering domestic demand and broad-based sectoral growth, corporate earnings are set to rebound. We forecast MSCI India earnings to grow by 13%/14% in CY26/CY27 respectively. Valuations remain at a premium, but the gap with EM has compressed to below the long-term average. Looking forward, a resolution in US-India trade relations could trigger a re-rating in the near term. Our India Quant Macro Indicator (QMI) points to a potential market catch-up, with cyclical dynamics favoring a renewed momentum strategy as India transitions from 'Early' to 'Mid' cycle. We raise our Nifty 50 base case target to 30,000 for end-2026. We also reiterate our preference for domestic over exporters.

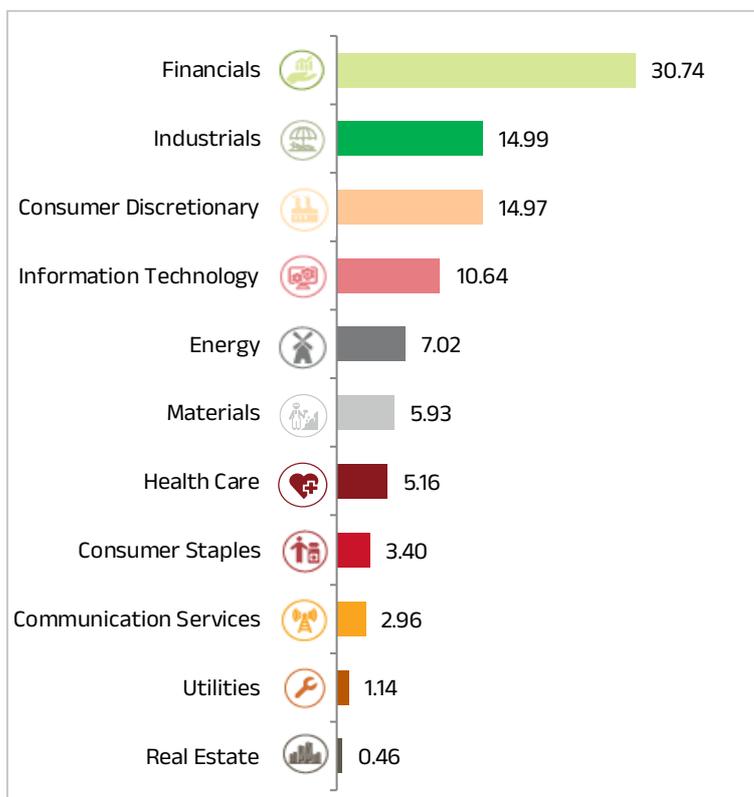

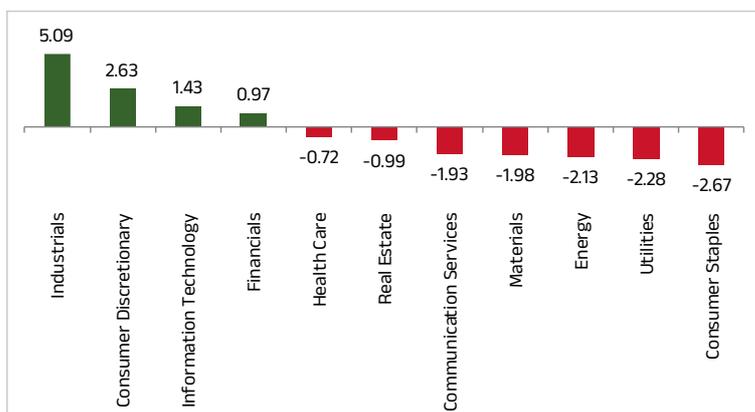

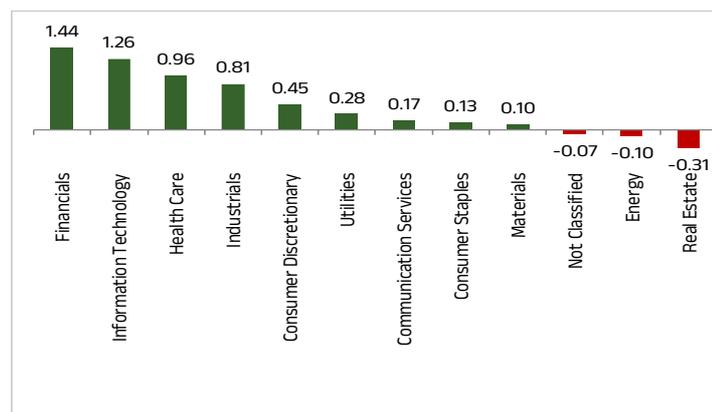
